### **Mission and Pastoral Measure 2011**

#### **Draft Pastoral Scheme**

**The benefice of Great and Little Bealings with Playford and Culpho and the benefice of Carlford, the benefice of Carlford, the benefice of Kesgrave; the benefice of Woodbridge Saint Mary; the benefice of Melton and Ufford; and the benefice of Woodbridge Saint John and Bredfield**

**20/10/2020**

The Church Commissioners have prepared a draft Scheme in respect of proposals sent to them by the Bishop for:

- *the termination of the group ministry established for the benefice of Great and Little Bealings with Playford and Culpho and the benefice of Carlford;*
- *the dissolution of the benefice of Great and Little Bealings with Playford and Culpho and the transfer of its parsonage house to the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Finance for diocesan purposes;*
- *the creation of the new benefice of Carlford (its area to now also include the parish of Culpho, with the constituent parishes all continuing distinct) ; for the parsonage house to be that of the old benefice of Carlford and for the future patronage arrangements for the new benefice;*
- *the creation of the new benefice of Kesgrave with Little Bealings and Playford (the constituent parishes all continuing distinct), for the appointment of the first incumbent of the new benefice and for his parsonage house to be that of the benefice of Kesgrave and for the future patronage arrangements for the new benefice;*
- *the creation of the new benefice of Woodbridge Saint Mary with Great Bealings (the constituent parishes continuing distinct), for the appointment of the first incumbent of the new benefice and for his parsonage house to be that of the benefice of Woodbridge Saint Mary and for the future patronage arrangements for the new benefice;*
- *terminating the Woodbridge Group Ministry that was established in 2000 and replacing it with a new one.*

The draft Scheme is on our website [www.churchofengland.org/consultation](http://www.churchofengland.org/consultation) or you may obtain a copy from me. **Large print and/or audio copies are available on request.** Anyone may make representations **for** or **against** all or any part of the draft Scheme (please include the reasons for your views) preferably by email or by post to reach me no later than midnight on **14 December 2020**. If I have not acknowledged its receipt, please ring or e-mail me. For administrative purposes, a petition will be classed as a single representation and we will only correspond with the sender of the petition, if known, or otherwise the first signatory for whom we can identify an address – “the primary petitioner”. When making a representation, please indicate the nature of your interest in the proposals (e.g. parishioner, member of parochial church council, etc) and whether you would like an opportunity to speak to the Commissioners regarding your representation if they decide a hearing should be held regarding the case. If we receive representations against the draft Scheme, we will send them, and any representations supporting the draft Scheme, to the Bishop whose views will be sought. Individual representors and the primary petitioner will then receive copies of the correspondence with the Bishop (including copies of all the representations) and will be told whether a virtual Zoom hearing is to be held. They and individual petitioners may comment further to the Commissioners. Copies of all of the representations received and associated

correspondence will be published on the Commissioners' website if the matter needs to be considered by the Commissioners. If a hearing is held, anyone may attend the virtual Zoom meeting of the Commissioners' Committee that considers the case and representors may have an opportunity to speak to it. Otherwise, if a hearing is not to be held, the case will be considered in private and you will be informed accordingly. When we acknowledge representations we will let individual representors (and the primary petitioner) know the next few dates of our Committee's meetings. We will confirm the actual date if a hearing is to be held nearer the time. The Committee will decide if the draft Scheme should proceed when it considers all the representations on the basis of a paper prepared by the Commissioners' staff and any points raised at the meeting. The Commissioners will notify all representors of their decision and give a statement of the reasons for it.

If they so decide, any representor or petitioner against the draft Scheme may seek leave from the Privy Council to appeal against the decision. Please see [www.churchofengland.org/consultation](http://www.churchofengland.org/consultation) for further information about the procedure.
