

## CTWA Meeting held on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> February in Salvation Army Church Hall

### **5. Brief Report of Recent Events**

#### Christmas card Distribution

All churches in CTWA received Christmas cards. It was noted that some used their parish magazine to distributed them. Going forward, maybe other parishes might wish to consider doing likewise? Delivery numbers were confirmed as accurate.

The size of the cards was discussed and it was agreed that the size for the next printing should be smaller than A5.

It was noted that the price of the cards for 2022 had increased because the quote from the printers had unfortunately not included VAT.

#### Warm Rooms

St Johns confirmed that, as there had been no take up, they decided not to continue with the initiative.

St Marys Woodbridge confirmed they have had take up and therefore would continue with the initiative.

After a brief review, the question of whether certain venues would be more obvious for those in need, e.g. Scout Hut, was discussed.

Whether the social aspect of the initiative should be more of a focus was also considered. However some thought that social events in church buildings tend to be populated by church members!

#### Keeping the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

A prayer and worship event was organised by Dave Tricker at Quay Church and 16 people enjoyed the gathering.

The date of January for the event was questioned but it was confirmed that, as an international event, the date will not suit everyone!

Dave was thanked.

What should be considered to mark this week going forward?

- It was questioned as to whether we should mark the whole 7 day period?
- Should future meetings include food?

- Should future meetings include a background video of events like the Big Family Day Out and the Good Friday walk of witness?

In 2024 the date will be Wed 18<sup>th</sup> – Wed 25<sup>th</sup> January, and it was suggested that this is entered into our church diaries.

**Action - Everyone – It was agreed to go back to our individual churches for review and prayer, so that on the CTWA meeting in May details can be further discussed and action agreed.**

#### Methodists

Our monthly men's breakfast is usually attended by 10-15 men, and we have now started a ladies group. Our first meeting was coffee and cake at Notcutts, but will hopefully evolve into other social activities. Saul and a small group are planning an away day that we hope will involve many of the members, from all 6 of his churches, and provide an opportunity to get to know each other as we are quite spread out.

#### St Mary's – Woodbridge

The services through the Christmas period were well attended in particular "Nine lessons and Carols by Candlelight" 19th Dec. and the 4pm. Christmas Eve "Crib service and Christingle" where there was standing room only. Candlemas celebration "*Tumbling in Light*" on 5th February with St. Eds cathedral 'In harmony' project was streamed and very well attended.

#### St Mary's – Great Bealings

We had a Tombola Stall at the Woodbridge St Mary's Christmas Fayre, and raised £200.

We had a successful Christmas Carol service, with children doing most of the readings. 72 people attending

We joined St Mary's Woodbridge at the beginning of January for the Epiphany service and held our usual mid-month service in Great Bealings

New hardwood churchyard bench installed and blessed in memory of Prof John Midwinter

We planted a number of shrubs and plants as part of the Queen's green canopy. This included 2 trees donated by the Bishop.

Soil samples were taken from the churchyard as part of a God's Acre citizens' science survey by Bangor University

We acted as a collection point for clothes for Earthquake victims.

#### St John's

St John's, with St Andrew's Bredfield, is prayerfully going through a Vision setting process and we are looking forward to where God will lead us as a church.

Our annual Holiday Club will take place during half term.

Quay

We have started the CAP life skills course and have 4 clients currently. We are exploring planting another congregation and seeking God in what that looks like.
